President's Report from the Annual General Meeting March 28, 2020

- Sadly, the 2020 Endocrine Society and endocrine nurses Society conference and 30th celebration has been postponed till 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- The 2019 ENS meeting in New Orleans included First Alliance conference with Acromegaly Society and the Pituitary Society- ENS supported 8 poster presentations
- Achieved two regional symposiums: 1st in Arizona in March 2019 and 2nd in Houston in October 2019
- Expanded committees and memberships: 6 committees and 14 committee members
- Membership growth of 50% over previous 2 years
- We expanded membership categories: students, retired and associated memberships including PAs, LPN
- More visibility with associate societies such as FINE, ISE, Pituitary Society, AACE
- Multiple collaborative projects: AACE, SW diabetes Symposium and Metabolic Institute American Conference. X 2 patient Education projects and joined Vision Health Advocacy Coalition re endocrine related eye diseases
- Website revisions, new pages now mobile friendly
- Launch of Endocrine Nursing Textbook, ENDO and ECE 35,000 downloads
- ENS philanthropic endeavors: the Certia Medico clinic in Bolivia
- Some Projected goals for 2020/2021: National /International certification for nurses in endocrinology and publishing a Journal for Endocrine Nursing.

Recently added information includes:



From the Research Chair...

Since taking on the role as Research Chair in October of 2019, I have been speaking with member to identify new ways to support the members in submitting poster submissions and grant applications. My primary focus is to "demystify" research and work to engage the membership to explore research, quality improvement projects and evidence based practice as important ways we can contribute to nursing knowledge and improve care for our endocrine patients. Some specific goals and activities for 2020-2021 include:

- Early announcements for ENS poster abstracts, travel grants, & research grant
- Providing mentoring for those new to research to help members show their work in posters and research projects
- Creating a streaming video for the website describing different types of posters & "howto" relevant for all levels of nursing practice and research experience
- Develop an ENS poster templates for first time presenters
- Provide a virtual info session for learning about research grants and feedback
- Sending e-mail blasts leading up to the meeting encouraging submissions and providing reminders of awards

I serve as Research Chair in several other organizations and I look forward to bringing lessons learned to the ENS. I am eager to work together to enhance the visibility of endocrine nursing research. One of my areas of interest is using community engagement and co-creation with patient organizations to develop innovative solutions for unmet needs. 
